The Power of Educators: Creating Multicultural Learning Environments

featuring Dr. Khyati Y. Joshi, Associate Professor of Education at Fairleigh Dickinson University

*Dr. Khyati Y. Joshi is an Associate Professor of Education at Fairleigh Dickinson University. Prior to joining the faculty at Fairleigh Dickinson, Dr. Joshi was a Visiting Assistant Professor at the Center for the Study of Ethnicity and Race at Columbia University, where for two years she taught Asian American Studies and Comparative Ethnic Studies. She also taught in the American Studies program at Princeton University. Dr. Joshi is the author of the book *New Roots in America's Sacred Ground: Religion, Race, and Ethnicity in Indian America* (Rutgers University Press, 2006), which was awarded the National Association for Multicultural Education's 2007 Philip C. Chinn Book Award. Dr. Joshi works with teachers and school administrators on issues relating to multicultural curriculum development and the needs of immigrant and second-generation students. She has also been an invited speaker at national conferences on Asian American issues and was part of a delegation that presented a forum on Asian American issues at the White House. Professor Joshi earned her doctorate in Social Justice Education at the University of Massachusetts-Amherst, received a Masters in Theological Studies from Candler School of Theology at Emory University, Bachelors in Religion from Emory University in Atlanta, Ga., and pursued post-graduate studies at the Hebrew University of Jerusalem.*



This institute is an intensive 4-day session recommended for educators and administrators interested in ways to enhance their understanding of multicultural learning environments. Attendees will explore the various dynamics of multicultural education such as anti-bias education related to immigration, religion, gender and transgender topics, sexual orientation, racial identity development and privilege. The institute is designed to take participants on a journey from awareness to action that will allow them to apply innovative techniques for multicultural education. They will experience personal and professional growth that will be an asset to their school's learning environment.
